We will be thinking about our school's core value of CURIOSITY and how asking questions can help us learn.



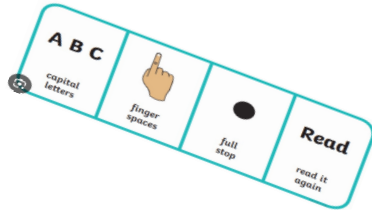
Key Vocabulary:

We will be learning to say a sentence, then write and read it back to check it makes sense.

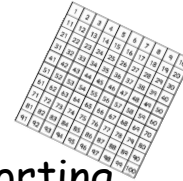
We will be using adjectives to describe. E.g. I have a tall, red house.

Mathematics:

Some of the skills we will be working on are:



- Sorting objects.
- Counting objects.
- Counting, reading and writing both forwards and backwards from any number between 0 to 10.
- Counting one more and one less.
- Using both the number line and hundred square.



- Recognising, naming and sorting both 2D and 3D shapes.
- Creating patterns with 2D and 3D shapes.

This will be used as part of Speaking and Listening, Role Play, Writing, Music and other areas of learning!



Design and Technology:

We will be building structures, exploring how we can make them stronger, stiffer and more stable.

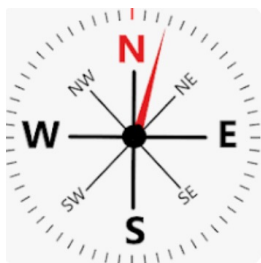
I wonder who will create a safe home for the three little pigs?



Humanities:

Looking at the Isle of Man, our school and local environment, we will be using:

- Simple compass directions such as North, South, East and West.
- Locational and directional language such as near and far, left and right.
- Aerial photographs to help us recognise landmarks.
- Our own maps and a key.



Key Vocabulary:

- Physical features e.g. beach, cliff, and coast.
- Human features e.g. village, farm, and house.

Science:

As scientists, we will be asking questions and exploring everyday materials such as wood, plastic, glass, metal, water and rock.

With these materials, we will be:

- Describing simple, physical properties.
- Comparing and grouping by their properties.
- Performing simple tests.
- Observing closely, using simple equipment.
- Using observations and ideas to suggest answers to questions.
